## Certificate / Credit Transfer

Students willing to transfer their credits earned during the exchange program at Ritsumeikan University must consult with their academic advisor or International Office of their home university beforehand in order to avoid trouble in transferring the credits. Accreditation is generally regulated under the regulations of the home university.

## Buddy

Ritsumeikan students play a great part in this program through their roles as volunteer buddies. They will also join participants on most field excursions for Japan Studies classes and also participating in the Japanese language classes as teaching assistants. ## Visa Support

Participants are responsible for contacting the Japanese embassy or consulate in their home country directly to determine if they are required to apply for a visa in advance. If it is determined that you need to obtain a visa, please notify the International Center.

The Medical Service Center offers medical assistance to students with health concerns. Consultations are available in English during certain times of the day.
